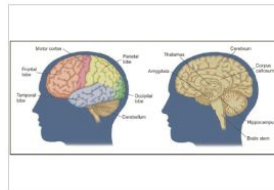
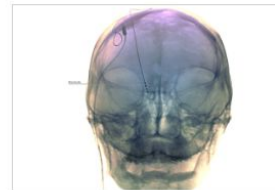


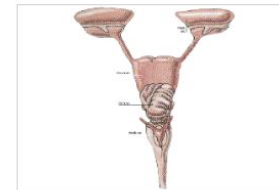
Figure 25.1. Brain Units



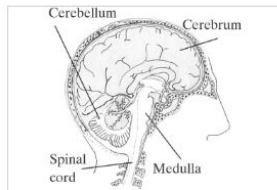

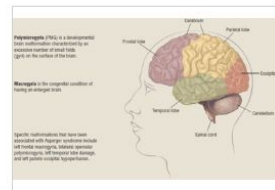

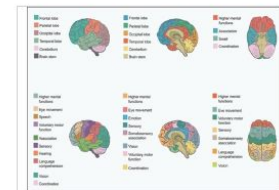

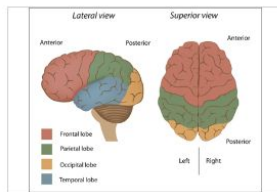

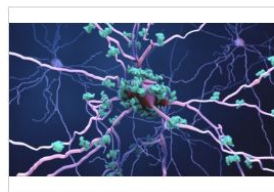

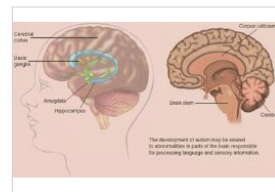

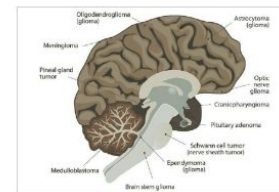

They are awkward on land (except on snow slopes down which they propel themselves at a rapid pace), but their wings have evolved into flippers, making them excellent swimmers.
